Background and objectives

- ❖ Study financed by the EAEF – EC ASEAN Energy Facility
- ❖ Under ACE – ASEAN Centre for Energy
- ❖ Period : June 2006 to December 2006

- ❖ *Objectives of the study:*
 - ❖ *Confirm the need for* the establishment of an ASEAN Business Council for Sustainable Energy Development
 - ❖ Work out the Structure, Master Plan and Road map
 - ❖ In close consultation with ASEAN stakeholders



Background and objectives (2)

- ❖ The private sector has to play its full role in the fulfilment of the objectives and action plan of APAEC 2004 – 2009
- ❖ Contribute to narrowing the development gap between ASEAN member States (IAI)
- ❖ Need to set up a platform to gather stakeholders from the private sector, national associations, State owned companies
- ❖ Three objectives of the Council
 - Develop the ASEAN regional Market
 - Dialogue with policy makers
 - Integration in International markets

 - ❖ Inputs from European organisations
 - European Parliament,
 - European Council;
 - European Commission;
 - Energy Associations – Power, Gas, renewable energy
 - Private investors (Suez,...)
 - ❖ Inputs from ASEAN private companies, associations and Banks
 - At the AEBF
 - Continued through the current stakeholder meeting

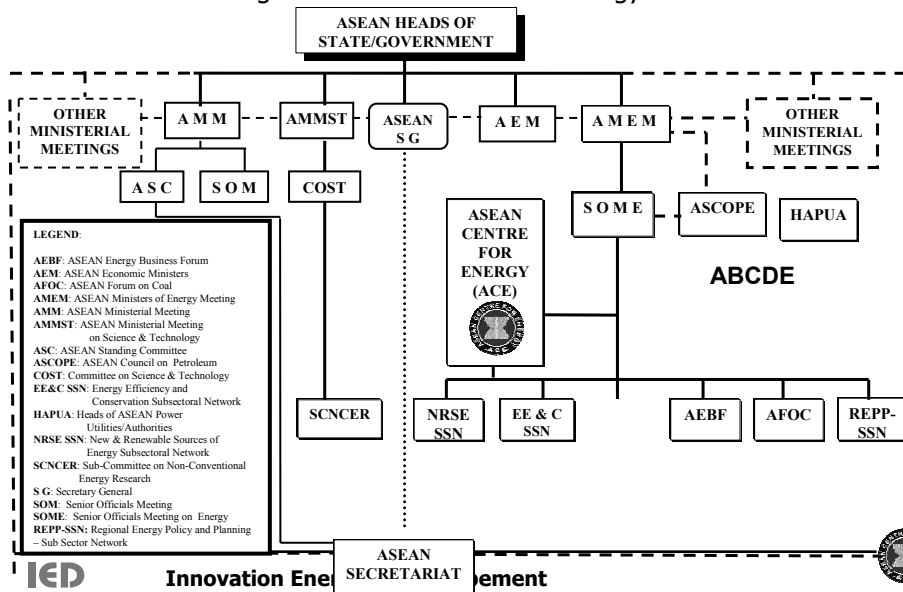


2 - Proposed orientations to date

Organizations in the ASEAN Energy Sector



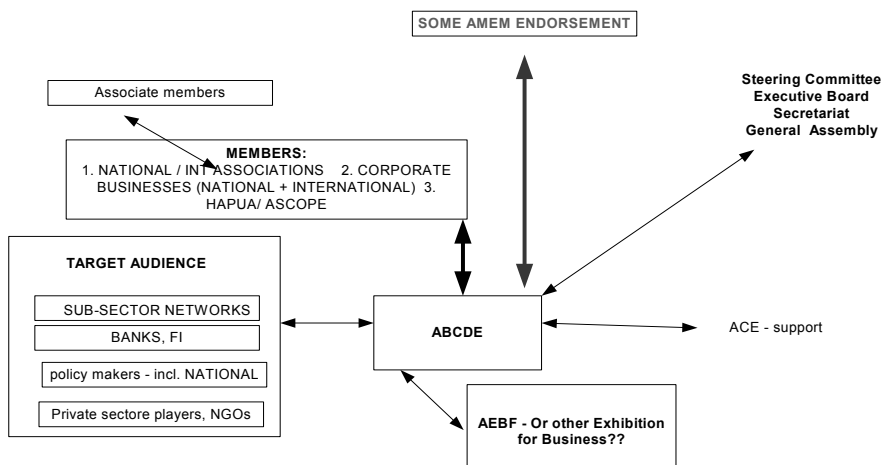


Proposed anchor, structure and governance

Proposed orientations (1)

❖ Proposed strategic partnership with the EU

- Parallel institutions: Parliament, Council, Commission, Private sector organisations
- Similar key objectives of the « Green Paper »: Energy security, Regional Market, Environmental sustainability
- In line with the « Partnership Strategy with SE Asia »
 - Expand investment flows
 - Support the Development of less prosperous countries
 - Specific policy areas: Transport, Energy, the Environment



Proposed orientations (2)

❖ Principles: in line with APAEC and IAI; no duplication with existing activities – Associations, SSN

- A. Networking and building partnerships
- B. Contribute to the development of an investment platform
- C. Identify thematic priorities
